Clean Water Services' NPDES Permit Overview - Jamie Hughes, Water Resources Analyst, Clean Water Services

Jamie Hughes provided and overview on the Clean Water Services NPDES permit. Some for the highlights included:

- Watershed-based NPDES permit renewal status and process
- Strategies being pursued with permit renewal
- Integrated Plan
- Primary issues on public notice draft
- Schedule and next steps

Permit objectives include:

- Continue to implement watershed-based approach
- Operational improvements: Flow-based limits
- Water quality credit trading
- Consistent use of Forest Grove WWTF & NTS
- Stream enhancement approach for sub-basin stormwater
- Enhanced reuse program for ecological uplift
- Efficient data management and reporting
